Nearly 150 Events Scheduled Throughout State

As part of the American Residency Program, the National Symphony Orchestra is scheduled to present nearly 150 performance, educational and outreach activities between April 29 and May 9, 2003. During the 10 days, members of the NSO will fan out across the state sharing their talent and their passion with North Dakota music educators, students, and audiences. The schedule is intense and the impact is expected to be significant and long lasting.

The 2003 American Residency is funded by the Kennedy Center through a grant from the **United States Department of Education** with additional support from the **National Endowment for the Arts**. Additional local support for the 2003 North Dakota Residency is provided by the **North Dakota State Legislature** through a **Lewis and Clark grant** to the **North Dakota Council on the Arts** and by **Arts Midwest**. Statewide media sponsorship provided by **North Dakota Public Radio** and **Prairie Public Television**. Additional assistance is provided by the **North Dakota Arts Alliance/Alliance for Arts Education**.

In addition to the full orchestra itinerary, a separate chamber ensemble tour is being undertaken by the BECS Quartet, featuring members of the National Symphony Orchestra. Their schedule is given in the accompanying release.
